



On Thursday 14th December, our 3rd year CSPE class visited the ISPCA centre in Keenagh, Longford. This centre, which opened in 2002, is situated on 88 acres in rural Longford. The centre provides veterinary care and rehabilitation to animals that have been subjected to cruelty or neglect. They can then be rehomed in a suitable environment.

We left school bright and early on Thursday morning. When we reached the centre we saw neglected animals such as cats, dogs and horses. We were introduced to some of the team that look after the animals in the centre. They brought us to the equestrian area which held some horses and donkeys who had been neglected by their owners. We were then brought to the cattery and introduced to some friendly cats who are looking to be rehomed. We met some lovely dogs who are back to their full health and are up for adoption.

After the tour we were delighted to present a donation to the centre on behalf of our school. We held a bake sale and raffle in school to raise money for the ISPCA. We are happy to think our efforts can make a small difference to some of these animals.
