STUDENTS MAD ABOUT SCIENCE

Of special interest was a visit from a Senior Scientist from State Pathologists Laboratory. Fifth Year Biology students received a talk from Forensic Scientist, Laura Galligan who spoke about her job and the tasks involved. She then went into the background behind why she loves her career and how each of her days is completely different. She outlined different sections of forensics and how many different jobs involved in the whole process of solving a crime. She explained the steps involved in a post mortem exam and how it is very difficult to pinpoint how a person has died. She went through how each organ can be damaged and showed diagrams to explain. Also, she showed the group fingerprints on glass that were identified by blood stains.

She explained how to get into a career in forensics and what courses to take in college and what the future prospects may hold in the job. Students were clearly impressed with the information. Cian Strolla stated: "Very interesting!" while Andrea Lynam said: "I would consider a career in forensics after the talk".
