MCS's Senior Ladies Football team have had a very successful year so far in the Leinster Senior A Championship campaign. They came out of their group winning all three games thus advancing to the semi-finals where they again gained the upper hand against strong opposition and are now in the senior A Leinster Final.

Our girls had the ideal start to their championship campaign when they defeated Loretto, Wexford in Ballylinen on the 14th of October. The final score line showed 4-10 to 1-11.

The second round of their campaign took place in gale force wind conditions against St. Joseph's Secondary School, Rochfortbridge in the Rochfortbridge GAA grounds. We managed to keep the home side completely scoreless for the entire first half, heading into half time on a score line of 4-10 to no score. Our sharpshooting forwards kept the scoreboard moving throughout the match and the final score line was 6-11 to 1-4.

The third and final round was a home game against Scoil Chríost Rí, Portlaoise which provided a tight, tense match where our girls battled hard to come out winners. The final scoreline of 3-8 to 2-10 meant the MCS girls won by a point to come out top of their table and straight into the Leinster semi-final.

We then advanced to the Leinster semi-final which took place on the 5th of December against Eureka S.S., Kells in Kinnegad. MCS had a slow first half, however following an excellent display of skill and leadership we emerged with a 5 point win, 8-9 to 5-7.

MCS Senior Ladies now face Scoil Chríost Rí of Portlaoise in the Leinster A final which is due to take place before Christmas.

TY Students making a difference in their community

A fresh group of TY students have taken up the development and maintenance of the Sensory Garden in Dún Na Sí Amenity and Heritage Park. They meet with the young adults from St. Hilda's Services Moate each Friday morning. Depending on the weather, they either work in the garden or do activities in St Hilda's Center in Tuar Árd. The garden requires continuous weeding, pruning and planting which the students have been enjoying. As part of their community involved in this project, the students helped out with 'The Halloween Spooktacular' as Zombies adding to the ghoulish atmosphere in Dún Na Sí. The development of the Sensory Garden is co-ordinated by Margaret Mandal (MCS).

The main focus this year is the design and construction of a Sensory Path. The students are investigating materials they can use along the path, considering colours, patterns, shapes, textures and sounds which will stimulate the senses. They hope this path will be particularly beneficial to people who have impaired senses or sensory processing disorders. The students are being supported by the staff and volunteers of the park in the construction of this path.

TY TRIP

to Temple Accommodation Direct Provision Centre in Horseleap

Recently the class of TY1 made a visit to the Temple Accommodation Direct Provision Centre in Horseleap as part of their Young Social Innovators (YSI) project. The class are completing their YSI project on the situation of Asylum Seekers in Ireland. They are very thankful to the manageress Tanya Hennigan for the invitation and to the residents for hosting them so warmly. On arrival the class were greeted by three of the residents who were from Georgia, Zimbabwe and Afghanistan. Each one spoke English quite well and shared their story in an informative and interesting way.

The class learned that there are 115 people living in the Centre altogether. This includes 18 children who attend local primary and secondary schools. The TY students decided that it would be nice to bring Christmas gifts to them. They held a Bake Sale in their school and from the proceeds they purchased teddies, dolls, footballs and board games for the children. The class were brought on a tour of some of the facilities in the centre open to the residents; which included a shop, a small gym and a communal kitchen, toy room, living room and dining room. To finish off a great experience Roisin O'Hara and Emily Ray played some Irish music to provide them with a taste of our culture.

Overall from this worthwhile experience, the students learned that these Asylum Seekers are just normal people who want to escape the difficulties of their home country, to contribute to Ireland and work and ultimately to just live normal lives. When the class finish their research, they plan to give awareness talks in the school on this issue.

Awards Ceremony for Pope John Paul II

Seventeen of our students were recently presented with Pope John Paul II Awards by Bishop Francis Duffy in St. Mel's Cathedral Longford.

MCS was one of many schools who took part in this award, where students have the option to earn a bronze, silver, gold or the Papal Cross medal. The award requires students to take action in their community and parish by fulfilling anything from eight to twenty-six weeks of community work. The seventeen students who received the award were involved in a number of activities, from; taking part in Tidy Towns committees to visiting Nursing Homes and St. Hilda's in Athlone for their community aspect and, reading at Mass, travelling

to Lourdes with the Carmelites, singing in choirs and cleaning Churches for their Parish hours.

A short prayer service opened the award-giving ceremony where students took part in readings and prayers and also gave their own, personal experiences of taking part in the award. Those who attended received certificates along with their medals. Our school was proud to be a first for the Diocese of Ardagh and Clonmacnoise with Michael Hunter receiving the Papal Cross. Following the Prayer Service and Awards Ceremony, there were refreshments in the crypt under the beautiful Cathedral. It was a lovely ceremony and the day was thoroughly enjoyed by all.

Science and more Science for Science Week 2019 at MCS

Science was the theme in MCS during Science Week, 11th-15th November, ranging from Science Magic, Science Quizzes and Science Shows. There was a Science Fact of the Day and an Element Quiz Question, with prizes for the winners. 'Climate Change' was the theme for the Poster Competition. The MCS National winners of the Angus Irish Angus Breeders Association held a 'Guess the Weight' of their winning calves competition and showed off their fast growing calves.

TY's introduced Science Experiments with First Years. TY students, once again, took over the First Year Science classes for the week. The students set to work by demonstrating many fascinating experiments they had prepared. These experiments included turning copper coins into silver and gold, making an iodine snake using Hydrogen Peroxide, and creating a dust explosion. It was a very enjoyable experience for all showing that Science really is fun!!

ISTA Senior Cycle Science Quiz

On the 14th of November, three teams of Sixth Year Science students represented MCS in the Regional Final of the ISTA Senior Cycle Science Quiz in Athlone Institute of Technology.

The students answered questions over a range of topics across several areas of Science including Chemistry, Physics and Biology.

Science Week Demonstrations

The TY Science team of James Costello, Caoimhe Lowry, Hazel Kelly, Kevin Seery, Ben O'Connell, Emma Hynes and Chloe Heavin carried out a number of experiments introducing 1st Year Science classes to Junior Cycle Chemistry and Physics. They demonstrated the features of chemical changes using simple reactions. They also illustrated the impact of concentration on reaction rates using an iodine clock reaction. Finally, they taught the First Years about forces using eggs. The students impressed the teachers with their excellent presentation skills as they introduced difficult topics in science in a fun engaging way.

Strong Women in Science Show in Tuar Ard

On Wednesday 13th November, 95 TY students and 80 First Year students participated in a fun, lively and fast-paced circus performance hosted by Tuar Ard. This workshop was supported by Westmeath County Council, Strongwomen in Science, the Institute of Physics and the Royal Society of Chemistry.

Jupiter's Trip to Birr Castle

It was a frosty sunny morning when First Year class group Jupiter set off to Birr Castle. The tour and workshop was delivered by Áine Flood of I-O FAR and Trinity College Dublin. The students were given a tour of the historic Great Leviathon Telescope, built in 1845 and the modern Irish Low-Frequency Array Radio Telescope, built in 2017. Then they went indoors for their Space Workshop where they focused on the enormity of Space, as well as discoveries and advancements in technology over the centuries.

All activities organised by the energetic and enthusiastic Science Department at MCS were fun and stimulating proving Science is all part of our everyday life.
