



REGISTERING WITH EUNICAS



Rarely do these universities select students, based on points/grades.

You can filter choices through:

- 1. Reputation
- 2. Fee levels
- 3. Whether there is an entrance test and, if so, whether test is sat in Ireland, or not
- 4. Number of Irish studying in that university
- 5. Whether Physics is required (a small number of programmes)- medicine/health science
- 6. Cultural match

THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN THINKING ABOUT STUDYING IN EUROPE



- Reputation can be measured through global rankings, both by institution and subject, but it could be argued that too many people get caught up in rankings.
- They might be a good measure of postgraduate/doctoral research output, but don't necessarily measure the quality of the undergraduate experience, particularly of the English-taught programmes.
- Regarding Medicine-reputation can be helpful (but, again, it is often not a major factor in securing SHO or Internship positions).

Those with highest reputation tend to be the Dutch, the top Italian, the Czech, Hungarian and top Polish med schools. The med schools in Baltic states also

beginning to secure good reviews.

CATEGORY 1 (REPUTATION):

- U. Malta: free fees; highly competitive
- U. Groningen or U. Maastricht [but only Years 1-3 in English]: entry highly competitive. (Application deadline 15 January)
- Public Italian med schools [eleven]. Some very good med schools, where fees fixed with reference to family income. Happy to make recommendations, concerning Italian med schools.

IN CATEGORY 2 (COST)- MEDICINE



 Guy Flouch can advise you on those that have entrance tests in England or Ireland, or those few that don't require entrance tests at all.

Note that, in 2020 - 2022, most universities had their entrance tests online and some might do so again in 2023.

CATEGORY 3-LOCATION OF ENTRANCE EXAM FOR COURSES REQUIRING THEM



- Guy Flouch can advise you on those with the greatest number of Irish/UK students.
- There seems to be a much better cultural match for Irish students in Poland/Italy than in Hungary/Czech Republic. and further east.

CATEGORY 4 (NUMBERS OF IRISH/UK STUDENTS)




In most countries, you have a Right to an Education, if you meet minimum entry requirements.

These requirements are invariably lower, often significantly, than those being set by Irish and UK universities.

- ➤ This is not a reflection of quality, though note that nine Dutch universities are higher-ranked than Trinity College, Dublin.
- It is a simply an indicator that, in Ireland and the UK, our thirdlevel education system is under pressure, as more and more students chase a small number of places in our universities.

- Places are available on degree programmes, in a wide range of disciplines, including Health Sciences, Arts & Humanities, Life Sciences, Social Sciences, Engineering & IT and Business.

PLACES ARE AVAILABLE...



- The cost of attending many universities is often much lower than registering for an equivalent programme in Ireland or the UK. There are no fees for Irish students studying in the four Scandinavian countries, or Germany.
- In the Netherlands, fees are just over €2000 PA.
- > Fees are also low in Italy.
- ► In addition, where there are fees, some countries offer Tuition Fee Loans, which cover these fees, with generous repayment terms.
- Other countries, subject to conditions, offer loans or grants to contribute to living expenses. Irish students who are qualified for Maintenance Grants can take them with them, to public programmes in Continental Europe.

FREE OR LOW FEES

Programmes are offered by some of Europe's leading Research Universities as well as some excellent Universities of Applied Sciences and University Colleges, which are career-oriented institutions.

QUALITY OF YOUR EDUCATION IN EUROPE

- Apply direct to European Universities or through <u>www.eunicas.ie</u> which has details of 689 programmes at 226 universities.
- Irish students can apply for up to eight degree programmes, taught through English, in universities in Europe. Eunicas will guide and support you through the application process in the very different and occasionally confusing national systems.

1. Register with EUNICAS

When your register to join EUNICAS, you will:

- be able to set up your own Eunicas account.
- add programmes to a shortlist in your account as you browse our extensive database.
- select between one and eight of your shortlisted programmes and elicit support and assistance so that you can apply to them. When you do this, you will receive Application Guidelines from us, for each of the programmes that you are applying to, in support of your application.
- Know that your chosen universities have been alerted to your interest.
- be able to access us with questions about your applications.
- receive regular alerts as to deadlines, events and vacant places.



2. Step-by-Step Guide to Using Eunicas

- ▶ Register with us, entering basic personal details.
 - Pay your Registration Fee of €38.
 - Go into your Eunicas account and create a personal password.
 - Browse the Eunicas database and add programmes to a Shortlist in your account.
- (Note that the only way to add programmes into your Pre-Application Form is by short listing them first, which you do by visiting each course profile you are interested in and click 'add to shortlist')

HOW TO USE EUNICAS



- Complete your on-line Pre-Application Form (which you need to do in one sitting, you can't save a part-completed form).
 - Submit your Pre-Application Form by pressing Submit Now. You will be automatically emailed a copy of your Pre-Application Form.
 - You will be e-mailed, within two working days, copies of Application Guidelines for each course you have submitted on your Pre-Application Form.
- Please check your Junk or Spam folders for these if they are not in your emails.

****(Please note that you should submit your Pre-Application Form to us, at least five days before the application deadline given for the programme that you are applying to so as ensure you will receive our Application Guidelines on time. and have time to collect relevant documents, some of which will need to come from your school.

- Follow the instructions in your Guidelines, to complete your application to the relevant university, always remembering that you can contact us with questions.
