Common Terms



- Student Contribution = annual charge payable to colleges for the costs of student services and examinations - varies up to max €3000
- College Fees = 3 three elements
- 1. Tuition fees
 - 2. Student contribution charge
 - 3. Compulsory field trip expenses

SUSI – Two Grant Types

- 1. FEE GRANT either pays €1500 or full amount of €3000
- 2. MAINTENANCE GRANT paid monthly to the student amount determined by family income:



JULY 7th

Adjacent = under 30km / Non adjacent = over 30km



Student Universal Support Ireland

- About 110,000 applications every year -
- About 75% to 80% are successful (full or partial grant)
- Even if in doubt, it is still worthwhile applying
 - €1500 lowest you can receive
- Depending on income, you could get
 25% / 50% / 75% / 100% of Maintenance Grant
- Special Rate Grant you can get double Maintenance Grant if family income is below €25000

KEY ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Approved full-time course
- Lived 3 out of last 5 years in Ireland, EU, EEA / Switzerland
- Income Level
- Progression through education
- Towards a major award e.g. Level 5,6,7,8
- NOTE: All students under 23 on Jan 1st, 2024 are regarded as 'Dependent'

- Handy calculator for estimating if an applicant is eligible and what level of grant award may apply
- However, it should not be taken as gospel only the real application will tell the full story - apply and get your answer - there is an appeals process
- There is a helpful application guide at the bottom of the SUSI homepage which assists in filling out the extensive online form



Create Online Account



SUSI

- You must open an online account with SUSI before you can make your grant application... see www.susi.ie
- Fill in and submit your online application
- Provide complete and accurate information (DOB, PPS numbers, bank details, CAO / UCAS number) as failure to do this will delay processing of your application

Application Process



- Make your application online
- Supply supporting documentation

SUBMIT

- Receive a decision on your application
- If successful, grant payments will be made monthly
- You must re-apply each year for your grant

SUSI

- 1. Section a personal details (of applicant)
- 2. Section b nationality & residency (of applicant)
- 3. Section c course details, previous education, and other sources of financial support (of applicant)
- 4. Section d personal details (of parent(s)/legal guardian(s)
- 5. Section e dependent children and relevant persons (of the household)
- 6. Section f income (of applicant, parent(s)/legal guardian(s)

RECKONABLE INCOME

- Gross income earned in 2022, including any benefits-in-kind, from all Irish and foreign employments;
- **Social welfare income** other than child benefit; self-employment income (losses), including farming income (losses) earned at any time during 2022, (there are adjustments for capital interest paid, family wages etc.)
- All rental income earned (after allowable expenses)
- Gross amount of all interest or income earned from savings, deposit accounts and personal loans made by you and any investments in 2022
- Income from maintenance payments; lump sum payment received during 2022 from retirement or redundancy; income from disposal of assets and rights, and gifts or inheritances

INCOME ASSESSMENT

- NOTE Gross family income is determined by combining the income of legal guardian/s with any earnings of the applicant / student
- Working siblings therefore do not count because they are <u>not</u> the applicant's legal guardians
- In some cases, grandparents, aunts, uncles or a state appointed person may be the assigned legal guardian
- Where parents have separated, income is calculated on the basis of the parent with whom the applicant is living plus the maintenance paid by the other parent



APPEALING SUSI DECISION

 If refused or decision is contestable, the applicant has 30 days to appeal

• If supporting paperwork (social welfare info) is not available within the 30 days, it is advisable to lodge the appeal immediately, making the delay in obtaining paperwork known and requesting (if necessary) an extension of the appeal to 60 days

Change of Circumstance

- SUSI assesses the financial year of 2022 for students applying for the 2023/24 academic year
- Changes may occur to a family situation within the timeframe that need to be referenced to SUSI
- Job loss illness family break up parental bereavement
- SUSI need to be informed by the applicant in order for the 'change of circumstance' provisions to be applied and the grant reassessed

the best form of communication with SUSI - you will always get a clear response and you have it writing should you need it



Holiday Earnings Provision

- Students in full time education can have up to €4500 of their holiday earnings ignored by SUSI calculations if they can show that the money was earned during holiday time (not term time) while in fulltime education
 - namely, 2 weeks at Christmas, 2 weeks at Easter and the three months of the Summer holidays
- Could make the difference!

NEW STUDENT CONTRIBUTION GRANT €500

• A new student contribution grant of €500 has been introduced for undergraduates student. To be eligible, a student must meet all eligibility criteria including income criteria. The total household income for grant assessment purposes must fall with the thresholds below...

NUMBER OF DEPENDENT CHILDREN	INCOME THRESHOLD
Less than 4 dependent children in household	€100,000
Between 4 and 7 dependent children in household	€109,600
8 or more dependent children in household	€118,806

Main College Expenses

- Rent living on campus / renting near college / commuting from home
- Transport Distance / Time / Public Transport / Car-sharing
- IT Laptop IT loans from college / IT availability in library / old laptops
- Books / Stationery / Printing Using the library service to the full
- Medical Expenses Medical Card / Student Medical Services / Counselling
- Placements / Fieldtrips (SUSI) / Dress codes / Course Materials
- Clubs Societies May involve some extra expenses / weekends away
- Grocery Shopping learning to budget and prepare basic meals

Using Student Services

- All colleges offer Student Services and most provide financial assistance to students depending on the particular need
- It is up to students to avail of the services available: to seek advice re budgeting etc
- SAF (Students Assistance Fund) Investigate what is on offer in whatever college you choose
- SEF (Student Emergency Fund) also
 €50 loans for short-term emergencies





External Student Supports

- 1916 Bursary This is for undergraduate students entering higher education for the first time
- It is worth €5000 to successful applicants and is awarded to socio-economically disadvantaged students
